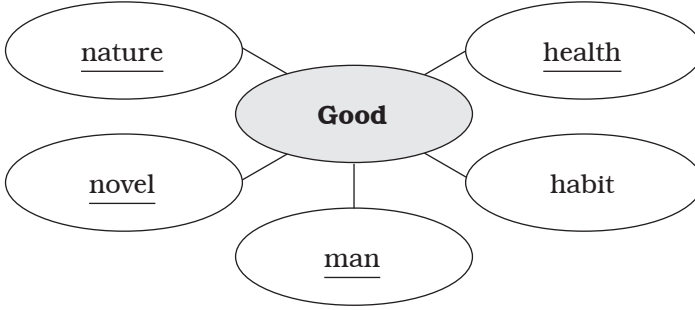

Valley of Death — Bermuda Triangle

The Bermuda Triangle is called Devil's triangle and considered to be a very dangerous and a mythical section of the Atlantic where dozens of ships, airplanes and people have disappeared without even radioing message, including the pilots of a squadron of U.S. Navy bombers. No one has proved the mystery of this region even after number of theories have been proposed. When Christopher Columbus was sailing through the area on his first voyage to the New World, he reported about a great flame of fire crashed into the sea one night and that a strange light appeared in the distance a few weeks later. He also wrote about a sliver of the Bermuda Triangle, one of the few places on Earth where true north and magnetic north lined up. Nothing was discovered even after number of incidents and casualties. No theory has proved the reason of it. Till it is considered as a mysterious section of the world.
